Ojibwe People's Dictionary

The Ojibwe People's Dictionary is a continuously expanding searchable Ojibwe-English Dictionary. This is a place where you can search words in Ojibwe or English, view words broken down to their roots, and listen to recordings of first language speakers (dialect noted).

Ojibwe Rosetta Stone

The Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe has partnered with Rosetta Stone to create an online Ojibwe language learning platform. They offer two levels of Ojibwe language and offer discounted rates to enrolled members of federally recognized tribes.

Ojibwemotaadidaa Omaa Gidakiiminaang

Based out of Fond du Lac Tribal and Community College, OOG hosts adult and family language immersion camps, as well as creates language resources for learners. Check out their language kits geared to pre-k students, and youtube channel to listen to first language speakers.
